Biographies on 2023 Candidates

Don Colter – *Current Treasurer and Endowment Conservator.*

Don Colter is a Centennial Member of the Idaho Wild Sheep Foundation. He was raised on a family ranch and feedlot in Colorado and Arizona. Ranch life gave him an appreciation for the outdoors and wildlife. At a young age Don hunted small game with his father and he soon moved up to deer and elk. Don has hunted mtn goats, moose, javelina, African game and recently harvested his first sheep, an Alaska Dall sheep. Don has a BS degree in Agricultural Economics and a MS in Agriculture-Business. He has been in agricultural finance and consulting for over 30 years in various capacities. Don believes in 'giving back'. He is a past Board member for the Boise YMCA. Don is a Hunter Education Instructor and has volunteered with the Idaho Fish and Game with deer research and bighorn sheep lamb surveys. Don's knowledge of wildlife, finance, and agriculture has served the Idaho WSF membership and the Board of Directors well.

Michael Keady – *Current Secretary, Lottery chairmen and Outreach committee.*

Born in Northern California, Michael has been an avid outdoorsman since he was old enough to tag along with his dad on pheasant and waterfowl hunts. As he got older his interests moved towards big game and he set out on a trial and error filled mission to learn how to hunt western big game animals. While attending the University of Nevada, Reno he was a founding member of a Ducks Unlimited chapter for the school and became more aware of Big Horn Sheep and all the challenges they face in trying to maintain healthy populations. Michael moved to Boise, ID in August of 2018 in pursuit of better hunting and fishing opportunities and to pursue a career in ranch and farm brokerage. He currently works for Berkshire Hathaway HS Silverhawk Realty, focusing on agricultural and recreational properties in Idaho and Oregon and he also works as part of the sales team for Clearwater Analytics, selling investment accounting software to investment management firms. He previously volunteered for Idaho Wild Sheep Foundation at the Idaho Sportsmen's Expo and is excited to continue contributing to Idaho WSF in any way he can.

Mitch McFarland – *Current director, Website chairman, Journal committee.*

Mitch was born and raised on a cattle ranch on Carmen Creek just north of Salmon, ID. He took over the family ranch after his father passed at age 18. After running the ranch for many years, he purchased an outfitting business in the late 1980's from an old outfitter, Packer John, that he'd been guiding for since the 1970's. He sold the outfitting business in the early 90's and continued to guide for several local outfitters, including Stan Potts, Dave Melton (who currently outfits in his old area), and managed the Flying B on the Middle Fork for a season. After selling the outfitting business he worked a variety of jobs in the Salmon and Challis areas, everything from surveyor to carpenter to mechanic to guide. He worked at Thompson Creek mines in Challis and at Beartrack in Salmon as a heavy equipment mechanic. He went back to school in the late 90's and graduated with a degree in Computer Science from the University of Idaho in Dec. of 2002. It was during the tech bubble meltdown, so he went back to work in Salmon surveying and working in a computer store. Finally, he got a programming job in 2005 in Albuquerque, New Mexico with Ball Aerospace. After working there for 2 years he took a job in Bozeman, MT with Zoot Enterprises where he worked for 3 years. Then in 2010 he moved to Butte, MT, where he currently works for a small family-owned business called Synesis7. He moved back to Salmon in 2016 and telecommutes.

Interest in Sheep Mitch is a lifelong hunter, his father was an outfitter in the 1960's, and he has many fond memories of going into hunting camp with his dad. Mitch drew his first sheep tag the first year he applied in 1984! After an arduous solo 6-day hunt with a horse and 2 mules hunting the lower end of the Middle Fork country he was successful on a beautiful full curl ram! Since then, he has guided clients and helped several friends on successful sheep hunts. Mitch has been a Wild Sheep Foundation, Idaho Wild Sheep Foundation, and Montana Wild Sheep Foundation member off and on over the years and recently became a lifetime member of the Idaho Wild Sheep Foundation.
